## *From the Pastor. . . .* **Something to Think About**

Well it has been about six weeks and I think I am going to stay. (*LOL as they say in text speak*)

It is an interesting dance that new pastors and congregations do in the beginning. I know we are listening to each other's words and watching each other's actions for signs that will help us to understand each other.

I have spent my first month and a half visiting people and ministries, getting to know how we work together, where God has brought you and me from, and where we find ourselves now. I have been greeted by warm welcomes and loving expressions of hospitality, as well as kind acts of giving and friendship. For Faye and me and our family I want to say "thank you".

This first year I intend to do a lot of listening and asking questions. I will also suggest changes and bring new ideas when appropriate and I am sure I will make my share of mistakes. Life is full of them.

Thanks also for your listening to me on Sundays as I try to preach the Word of God and also reveal my journey as a Christian and a pastor. Let me tell you a bit about that journey.

First, I am a Christian. Before being a pastor or a Presbyterian, I am first a follower of Jesus Christ. I know that may sound redundant to many. But it is first and foremost my identity before all else. I grew up going to church in the Episcopal Church through my middle school years. In high school I attended a Friends Church (Quaker) and in college attended Azusa Pacific University graduating in 1979. All of these were very important in the formation of my spiritual life.

After college I spent three years working in camps and conferences ministries along with jobs in the secular fields. My journey intersected the PCUSA when I began work as a youth director in a small Presbyterian Church in La Verne, Cal., under the leadership of Vic Pentz, who is now the pastor of Peach Tree Presbyterian church in Atlanta, Ga.

While I was there I began to sense a call to ministry and later began to explore a call to ordained ministry. This led to where I am today, which is a long journey and a story for another STTA. This is my story. And you each have a story. We are people of stories and how those journeys intersect with God's story in Jesus Christ.

I hope in these next few weeks we can start telling each other our stories and share how Jesus Christ has intersected our stories and how that experience has shaped each of us. Sharing our stories is the simple witness of God's people and I want us to be comfortable with telling our stories. I hope you will make an effort to attend one of the "Meet and Greet" groups in the upcoming weeks (see the list of remaining dates and times on page 5) so we can begin to share our stories.

Our faith is the Story of God and the call of God's people to follow Him. It is about the intersection of God's life in Christ with our lives. The result of that intersection with Jesus Christ is the story we are to share with the world. There is nothing more interesting to me than a good story. I will tell you mine if you will tell me yours. Who knows, we might see Jesus along the way.

## SESSION BRIEFS

### At its meeting on April 13, 2010, the Session:

· approved the Session minutes for the Stated Session meeting of March 16, 2010 and the Called Session Meeting of April 6, 2010.

· heard a report from Elder Joan Townsend on the March 25, 2010 Called Presbytery meeting. At the meeting, the General Presbyter Search Committee moved that its report be received and that Janet M. DeVries be called to serve as General Presbyter of Grace Presbytery.

· reviewed the current church policy documents. The various ministries discussed the status of the policy documents they are responsible for.

· received an update on the status of the Boy Scout Eagle project to refurbish the church playground. Pending weather interruptions, work is expected to be complete by May 1.

· heard a report from the Mission Ministry that New Day will not be awarding a scholarship this year.

· reviewed and approved a new version of the Caring Fund policy as presented by Pastoral Care.

· discussed the gift given to Grace by Laurie Powell's family. Because of Laurie's love for mission and her involvement in New Day, a motion

was made, seconded, and approved to allocate the gift to New Day.

· heard a request from the Vision Ministry to approve and authorize the development of a master landscaping plan. The cost of the plan will be covered by an anonymous donation.

· approved the plan as presented by the Vision Ministry to replace the carpeting and fixtures in the Nursery and Toddlers rooms.

· discussed a report from the Vision Ministry on the request to purchase two additional bells for the Bell Choir. Session voted to use the remaining \$425 from the Joan Fabio Memorial Fund and to allocate an additional \$500 from the memorial fund toward the purchase of the bells. Session also authorized the Bell Choir to use the 'Recyclamatic' fund raiser to raise additional funds.

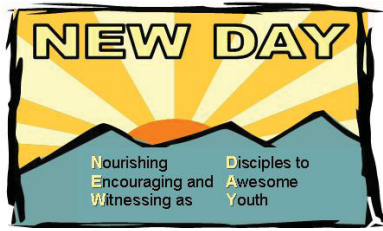

## *In the beginning ...*

### **25 Years Ago at Grace**

I drove north on Cooper not long ago and as I passed the Kroger at the corner of Green Oaks and Cooper, I glanced to my right and was reminded of our original church office. Rev. John Poling set up an office in his home when his family moved to Arlington. One of his first tasks was to find space that would accommodate evening meetings and allow for regular office hours without having to operate the church out of his home. The initial plan was to put a temporary building on our property on Mansfield Road. But meeting all the requirements by the City of Arlington kept that idea from developing. At the suggestion of the newly-formed Committee for Site and Building Planning, it was decided that the church would office at the Wimbledon Court Apartments. (Oh, yes ... only a few months old and we already had a committee with three knowledgeable real estate folks hard at work.) We leased a ground floor apartment very close to the front of the complex, with two bedrooms and two bathrooms. The apartment had everything we needed including a fireplace (we dreamed of cozy meetings), a kitchen and, best of all, free use of the apartment's community room and pool! John's office was set up in the larger bedroom and the host of volunteer secretaries operated out of the smaller bedroom. Of course, it took no time at all for desks and chairs, couches and tables to be donated. And what is it about pastors and their books? John's books overflowed the shelves that lined the "office," and the tub in the larger bathroom was filled with four-foot-high stacks of books too! It amazes me, as I look back on this time, that the apartment management was not bothered by the fact that dozens of people came and went from that apartment on a daily basis and at all hours of the day and night. Everyone had a key! God was certainly watching over us during that time of growth. There were exciting developments every week ... and joyful volunteers for every task. We were beginning to grow into a caring fellowship with a common goal of encountering Christ and responding to God's claim on our lives!
